
By partnering with other business lenders, educational institutions, not-for-profits, and municipal governments, we help grow and diversify the economy in our service area.

As the new Chair of the Board, I am honored to foster the growth of entrepreneurs in our district. I want to thank our past Chair, Steve Jeffers, for volunteering his time as Chair and for the support and guidance he has provided to me as we transition to our new roles.

In the past year, there have been many positive changes completed by the Staff and Board of Directors. In the fall of 2022, we worked to develop a new Strategic Plan. As part of the implementation of the new Strat Plan, we have focused on a section at each monthly meeting to ensure its ongoing success. Many of the board members have taken the time to complete training courses specifically designed for Community Futures. The countless hours they took to strengthen their knowledge and bring new innovative ideas to the table is appreciated.

In 2022-2023 PACF Credit Committee approved 8 loans for a total of \$401,478. We have one of the lowest loan delinquencies in the province, which is attributed to the thoroughness of the review by our General Manager. PACF introduced The Side Hustle MicroGrant program this past year. The program is for those with an entrepreneurial spirit who need assistance and direction on how to put their ideas into motion. I am happy to say we had 4 entrepreneurs complete the program and apply \$500 in funding toward their goal.

Last but certainly not least, we could not have had a great year without our dedicated staff; from the day-to-day management of the portfolio, budget, and training programs, to ensuring the office runs smoothly, and implementation of a new website was a big undertaking. We are grateful for each of them as a member of our team.

I look forward to next year with PACF. I am excited about the economic growth that is bubbling within the community and hope to grow the PACF name further within the district.

#### **LOANS**

Community Futures is an alternate source of business funding offering loans to businesses for start-up or expansion. Funding is available up to \$150,000 to be used for capital expenditures or operating requirements.

Flexible, affordable Community Futures loans are specifically designed for new start-ups, expansions, or to buy a business in a rural community. Solutions are tailored to meet the needs of the individual business and decisions are made locally.





#### **ADVICE**

Prince Albert and District Community Futures has been supporting businesses in our region for over 20 years. Our mandate is to provide a variety of support services to anyone wanting to start, expand, franchise or sell a business in the community. Our services include:

Small business coaching

One-on-one start-up or expansion consulting

Support in gaining access to other small business supports, information, & access to capital

Succession planning

The Entrepreneurs with Disabilities Program (EDP) helps people with disabilities or health conditions start or expand businesses.

This program is open to anyone with a viable business idea who has a self declared disability or a health condition.

We're funded in part by the Government of Canada's Opportunities Fund for Persons with Disabilities Program, Elevate provides assistance, support and resources to qualified individuals who wish to become self-employed.

Up to \$750 in funding is available for rural entrepreneurs with health conditions or disabilities to access professional services to move their business sales online, enhance their online services or improve online marketing.


